Health & Fitness Trivia

- Although your bones are hard, inside they are, in fact, light & spongy. They are about 3/4 water!
- The heart beats about 3,000 million times in an average lifespan.
- 56% of the body is liquid.
- Approximately 40% of the body is skeletal muscle & almost another 10% is smooth & cardiac muscle.
- Kidneys clean your blood. Each minute, about a quart of blood passes through your kidneys and comes out clean. In a lifetime, your kidneys will wash more than 1 million gallons of blood.
- There are four types of blood: A, B, O & AB. The most common type is O.
- The central nervous system is composed of more than 100 billion neurons.

Dress Code Guidelines

LTS does not allow "extreme hair styles". This includes but is not limited to

"...bangs are worn they must be above the eyebrow. Extreme hairstyles/cuts are not acceptable. Hair must be a natural color; severe or contrasting high lights are not permitted (red, greens, blues, pinks, etc.)."

Please also remember girls' shorts need to be worn, <u>past their</u> <u>fingertips</u>. Shorts not worn this long will get a dress code referral and will be sent to the Health Office to change. Greetings Families and Community Friends!

I am pleased to announce, Legacy Traditional Schools and Athlos Traditional Academy have chosen to seek national school Accreditation for our school system with AdvancED. AdvancED is the world's largest school accreditation organization, serving more than 30,000 public and private schools and districts across the United States and in more than 70 countries that educate over 16 million students. Accreditation with AdvancED is a voluntary method of quality assurance developed more than 100 years ago by American universities and secondary schools, and designed to distinguish schools adhering to a set of exceptional educational standards. *Please note that it is open seating and the tickets do not have assigned seating on them.



*The Arizona State tax credit is equal to the amount contributed or the amount of fees paid. However, for single taxpayers or heads of household, the credit cannot exceed \$200. For married taxpayers that file a joint return, the credit cannot exceed \$400. If married taxpayers file separate returns, each spouse may claim 1/2 of the credit that would have been allowed on a joint return. To claim this credit use Arizona Form 323.

Legacy Traditional Schools is a non-profit organization so any funds donated above the tax credit allowance can be used as an itemized tax deduction. We recommend consulting a certified tax professional to verify your eligibility to these credits/deductions.
